

In Loving Memory of Mbii Tanefouet Tsafack





Mbii Tanefouet Tsafack was the 4th Patriarch of the Tanefouet. He was one of the nine assistants to the Chief of Bawa. He passed away peacefully on July 5th, 2021, at the age of 93. He left behind more than 20 children (including BHI President and Co-Founder, Mbii Tanefouet Professor Blaise Dondji), more than 45 grandkids and 10 great grandkids. He lived in Bawa his entire life. He loved his family that he often traveled to the city to visit. That love of his children took him to Ellensburg, WA in 2010, his first trip abroad and first time to board a plane! Mbii Tanefouet Tsafack was a very pleasant and honest man, filled with the love of others. Though he never got any western education, he sacrificed for his children and pushed them in school to reach their full potentials. He once stated that "education is the key that opens many doors". He was involved in all the projects that could improve his community standard of living such as new roads and schools. He was trusted by many in Bawa and surrounding villages who voted him as chair of the parent-teacher association for more than six decades in a row, a position that he held until a year before joining his ancestors.

Mbii Tanefouet Tsafack, you may be gone from our sights, but you are never gone from our hearts.

"We support the BAWA Health Initiative because by doing so we can make a difference in the lives of people who need help. Administrative expenses are minimal, and substantially all of the support that we contribute is spent on the people that BAWA helps. The money is well spent on items that the target population needs, such as constructing, staffing, and equipping a clinic and supplying an ambulance.
