





#### The Homecare Program is Up and Running!

Established in 2024, the Homecare Program is now providing vital care to those unable to visit the clinic. A nurse and a village council member are traveling to patients' homes, ensuring they receive the care they need.

To avoid depleting clinic supplies, we aim to create dedicated homecare bags stocked with essential items. The health team has identified the necessary supplies, and a tracking system is in place to monitor visits and plan future care.

As resources grow, we will expand homecare services. We also hope to incorporate water filter inspections during visits.

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## Expanding Care Mission Trip to BAWA

More than a decade ago, Eric Davis took his first trip to Cameroon to support the construction of a medical clinic that would serve the village of Bawa. That visit in 2013 allowed him to work alongside the village health committee, gaining a deep understanding of their hopes and needs. Since then, his commitment to the clinic has helped it grow into a vital resource for the community.

In 2017, through partnerships with local healthcare facilities and emergency medical services, Davis and his team collected enough medical equipment and supplies to fill a 20-foot shipping container, ensuring the clinic was stocked for its opening. They spent three weeks setting up the facility and providing care more than 1,100 people, witnessing firsthand the impact of their work.

This summer, Davis and a team of physicians and nurses are returning to Bawa with a renewed focus: Women's Health, Home Health, Dental, and Optical Care. These areas were identified as critical during the 2017 visit, and the team is determined to provide essential services that will significantly improve the quality of life for the villagers.

#### Why These Services Matter

- **Women's Health:** Women in Bawa face serious health risks, from exposure to smoke while cooking in homes without chimneys to giving birth without medical support.
- **Home Health:**Many residents, especially the elderly and sick, struggle to reach medical facilities due to a lack of transportation. Bringing healthcare directly to them is crucial for improving their quality of life.
- **Dental Care:**With no local dental services, extractions are often the only solution for dental issues. This can lead to infections and serious health complications. Providing restorative dental care can improve overall health and longevity.
- **Optical Care:**Preventable blindness due to cataracts and other conditions is common. Access to eye care can restore vision and independence for many in the community.

As preparations for the trip continue, support is needed to ensure success. *Every donation goes directly toward this goal—none of us on the team take payment for the services we provide,*" Davis emphasizes.
